Club Archives

Tim Marshall reports on some interesting material which has come to light (now with Jill Bennett as the Club archivist)

Laura Hampton left a small file of ULGMC-related items when she and John left for Australia last year. Here are a few items which may be of interest.

1. The early years of ULMC

There are minutes of a meeting held at the Alpine Club on December 1st 1945 to discuss the setting-up of a University of London Mountaineering Club. The meeting was chaired by Geoffrey Winthrop-Young with, amongst others attending, Professor George Finch (he was on Everest in 1922). 33 students attended, from 7 colleges: Birkbeck, Borough Road (Teacher) Training College, IC, London Hospital, QMC, UC and Woolwich Polytechnic.

George Finch was keen for students to run the club themselves, and though senior members of the university would be willing to assist with the creation of a ULMC, he suggested they "could be thrown out of office as soon as their term of usefulness was expended."

In the end, a committee was established with one member from each of

the above colleges, except UC which had a large number of members at the meeting and was therefore allowed to nominate two members.

There are copies of the hand-written minutes of the ULMC committee, as far as 2nd May 1949.

2. Establishment of ULGMC.

There is a circular letter from Stella Chapman (who later became Stella Berkeley) to ULMC members in mid-1950 about establishing a "senior branch" of ULMC. The membership fee would be 7s 6d. (II)

- 3. There is a booklet written by John Burrows in 1996 about the acquisition of Fallcliffe Cottage.
- 4. Finally, there is some correspondence relating to the detention by the Polish authorities of Janusz

Onyskiewicz. Janusz was one of the cohort of great Polish Himalayan climbers of the late 1970s and 1980s. He came into the orbit of ULGMC because he married Alison Chadwick, a ULGMC member (and high-altitude climber) who was lost on Annapurna in 1978. Subsequently, Janusz became a leading light in Solidarnosc, and was detained and imprisoned in Poland for what were regarded as political activities.

There are (copies of) letters from Laura to the Polish Ambassador, and to Chris Bonington asking him to write to the Polish Ambassador (he did), from academic mathematicians in this country (Janusz was a mathematician), all protesting about J's continuing detention. There is, perhaps not surprisingly, no evidence of any reply!
