Fallcliffe Meet re-opening, 18-20 May

exploring the Tors near Ladybower Reservoir on the Saturday. We spotted lots of red grouse and an elusive mountain hare so a good zoological outing it was! Sunday turned out to be gorgeous sunshine so we got to climb at Lawrencefield and had a splendid day pushing our grades.

Brecons Beacons meet, 15-17 June

The trip to the Brecon Beacons in early August was a new meet for this year (or at least new in the time that I have been in the club) but a destination we went to a few times with ULMC. We stayed in a hut owned by the Westminster Speleological Group, which had all of the usual features of a mountaineering hut. On the Saturday we took a drive down to the Gower for sea cliff climbing. After an impromptu walk across a beach due to parking difficulties for the crag and then finding the crag (Great Tor at Three Tors, between Oxwich and Three Cliffs Bay) in the "traditional" South Wales guidebook we did some climbing. Most notable for me was "East Ridge", I think ascended by everyone in the group at some point during the day. Post climbing, there was a little sea swimming before a return to the hut for my curry. On Sunday, we all went for a walk from the hut, most notable for its many waterfalls. This included the path going behind the waterfall and also another swim. Thanks to all who attended for making it an enjoyable meet, possibly to be repeated next year.



Welsh Coastal meet 2nd -6th July 2012

A select band of Club 'seniors' assembled for the camping meet on the Welsh coast. Aberaeron once again was the venue; the camp site basic but more than adequate and very friendly; the weather – mixed, but not disastrously wet at any point. Mike and I failed to get our tent down in the lull between squalls on the day we left and had a very wet tent to bring home – drying it proved a serious challenge as it never seemed to stop raining – remember?



Our cars stayed on the camp site until we left – we made good use of public transport and felt very virtuous! Twice we caught the bus to Aberystwyth and once back from Newquay having walked the coastal path there from Aberaeron. In Abersytwyth we took trains – once the steam train up to Devil's Bridge and the second time all but one of our party the funicular up to Constitution Hill.

Our walk from Devil's Bridge was the best of our 3 walks. We followed the Mynach valley - going out from Devil's Bridge on its northern side and returning on the opposite side. There was a problem following the route description - a path had been diverted in a seemingly senseless way and we failed to find the correct bridge to cross the river - at one point trying to proceed upstream clinging to a fence just above the fast running water! Bill T saved the day and we successfully made it back to Devil's Bridge without getting out-of-theordinarily wet. The steam train ride was a delight and for the downward journey the cloud layers lifted and we were able to appreciate the very beautiful scenery.



From Constitution Hill we walked north to Clarach Bay – hideously full of permanent caravans and chalets – then followed the Clarach river upstream before turning to return to Aberystwyth by another route. Again we had a problem with interpreting the route description at a point where a nature reserve had newly been created, but we eventually found something that more or less corresponded to what we should be doing! It was a most enjoyable meet – come and join us next year when it is likely that we'll move to the Lleyn Peninsula.

Symonds Yat Report

We crossed the river to Symonds Yat East to explore the more moderate climbs on limestone. The range is amazing and all in a remarkably clean and sound state, unlike the climb we attempted last year.

It is certainly not a Burbage or Stanage with wide stances for groups to congregate. You have to be careful taking pictures!



On the Monday we had booked open canoes and kayaks, this time starting further upriver at Ross and ending, after a lunch at Kerne Bridge, at Symonds Yat. The river was very full after 2 weeks of rain and the Monday was the first day the companies had allowed unguided groups on several sections. Jack is now a little more comfortable in the canoes but I fear he will never gain his sea legs!

After Heather and Stephan had left us we visited Hereford on, probably, the hottest day of the year. Despite the possibility of unnumbered hours of shopping the rest of the family were happy to return early to the cool of the campsite to prepare for a BBQ.




